- □ 5. Schedule testing for the ACE exams These exams allow you to attempt to move forward in either the ASN or BSN programs. To test

out of the ASN or BSN nursing courses LPN's will need to schedule the ACE exam with the Academic Resource Center (ARC). There is a cost associated with the exam. To gain credit value (CV) for the course you will need to score a 70% or higher on the exam. Students are allowed to take each exam up to two times.

BSN: Childbearing, Childrearing, Pharmacology, and Mental Health.

- The BSN program can be completed in as little as 16 months depending on the degree you wish to pursue and your score on the ACE exam.
- The ASN program can be completed in as little as 12 months depending on the degree you wish to pursue and your score on the ACE exam.
